# **ABOUT THE PARK**

Tijuana River Valley Regional Park offers more than 1,800 acres of diverse habitats to enhance visitors' experiences - from dense riparian forests along the Tijuana River to coastal maritime sage scrub on top of Spooner's Mesa. Experience the extensive system of trails that link the many habitats in this fertile river valley. Tijuana River Valley is one of the only places in San Diego that offers seasonal beach access for horseback riders.

Some of our trails are designated equestrian and hiking only. You can hike, mountain-bike and ride horseback along 22.5 miles of multiuse trails, or bring your binoculars to track some of the 340 native and travelling bird species at a park that sits beneath the Pacific Flyway. The park also offers a community garden, a bird and butterfly garden, multiple sports fields, children's play areas and a campground.

#### SPOONER'S MESA HIKE Sunday, June 11, 9 a.m. Meet at the Campground

Can you climb 40 stories? Here's your chance! Embark on a steep climb to the hill above the campground known as Spooner's Mesa, where you will be treated to epic views of the U.S. and Mexico coastline, including Coronado and Cabrillo. See where the rivers meet the ocean and listen to rangers as they discuss the unique ecology of this wetland habitat.

### **BIRD WALK**

Sunday, June 18, 9 a.m. Meet at Dairy Mart Pond Parking Lot

Hundreds of bird species frequent Tijuana River Valley - some native, some migrating, but all documented under the realm of the Pacific Flyway. Birdwatchers flock here to view them in the wild, enjoying the discretion of an innovative bird blind and thick native vegetation. This educational walk-and-talk activity takes place along a 1-mile loop trail on relatively flat terrain, and is great for families and travelers on wheel.
